President's Update October 2023

Spring has sprung so for us on the Sunshine Coast and that means our wildflowers are coming to an end and our warmer days are on the way. A bit of nature, sunshine and warmth on our skin and activity is a great way to improve our physical and mental well-being. Remember our activities are not just about getting from point A to point B, but activating our senses within the bush with the sounds, sights, smells and touch to give that added pleasure to life.

Spring also means a new activity program for the SCBWC for the next six months. Thanks to all those who attended our planning meeting at Foote Sanctuary, Buderim on 17/9 to put together a diverse range of activities. Check out the new program on our website. Thanks to Linda Gregory for working with us all to get a program together and the leaders that have given us their time to organise and take us out on a hike, cycle, kayak or abseil.

The SCBWC committee had a management meeting in September and I'd like to update you on some items below:

- AGM is returning to the November club meeting since the books are not required to be audited now. The AGM is Monday 6 November 2023.
- The April 2024 Club meeting will be held on Sunday 7 April at the Maroochydore Botanical Gardens. The Sunday meeting is a trial to allow members that cannot attend the Monday evening meetings due to work, driving at night, distance from Buderim to join us all. There will also be a walk in the gardens after the meeting.
- Reminder that when at Base Camp activities, the activity led or organised by the leader for the day is the activity covered by the club insurance. A member that is undertaking their own activity during the base camp eg cycle, different walk solo isn't on the planned activity and will be reminded of this if the situation arises.
- The months activities are **open for registration at the monthly club meeting**. This is to encourage all members to attend the club meetings, catch up with fellow members and sign onto the activity. If a member cannot attend the meeting please contact the leader after the club meeting to have your name added to the registration.
- It a leader cannot attend a club meeting, the details of the walk that will be provided to those at the meeting will be the activity, meeting place and time for registration. Members will be referred to the website or to contact the leader regarding the full description and details.
- The AGM in November means that the **committee positions become vacant**. The club committee will require a replacement for Linda Gregory (**Walks Co-ordinator**) and Lorri Carroll (**New Members**). Please speak with Linda, Lorri or another committee member on the roles. The club is only as good as those that get involved. We have included the position descriptions for each role in this edition of the Trudge. The club would like to thank both Linda and Lorri for their work on the committee in the last few years.

There are some IT changes occurring.

- 1. The walk description for walks open to prospective members we are organising to have available for general viewing on the website. The activity meeting place, time and leader details will still be protected.
- 2. Walk leaders will be given access to enter the activity details directly into the activity calendar portal. The activity will then be approved by the Walks Coordinator as per our insurance requirements.

It was another busy month making the most of the great weather and wildflowers.



Adventure awaited when we all met at Cleveland ferry terminal to take that boat ride across to North Stradbroke Island. It's been a while since most of us had been to the Island.


Our itinerary for the weekend entailed:

Did you know?

Fernberg (Government House) is open every 6 weeks on a Thursday morning between 9am-10am for a guided 'bushwalk' through the bushland part of the estate. BWQ have advised us that it is open to the public. Bookings have to be made online. Please contact Neralie (Secretary) if you require more information.

Koala Sightings App

As part of the Qld Government's Koala Protection Strategy and mapping, it is requested that all bushwalkers download the QWildlife app to record sightings. This app will add data to the Qld Koala map and enhance the Koala Protection Areas to further advise future planning. https://environment.des.qld.gov.au/wildlife/animals/living-with/koalas/report-sightings

Originally this app was introduced to report crocodile sightings but koalas have been added to it.

The Scenic Rim Regional Council is actively collecting koala scat for DNA analysis to determine particular groups of koalas.

Gheerulla Circuit from Sam Kelly Rd

Linda, Leanne, Jeff, David, Sarah, Judy, Nick and I set off from Sam Kelly Road on a cool overcast morning. Instead of having to navigate across Gheerulla Creek to start, the watercourse was eerily empty and silent. We set off to do the circuit anticlockwise to get the steep climb up the ridge done early in the day and the views across in all directions were spectacular as usual. For the first hours of the walk we crossed paths with quite a few runners and folk training, a couple of groups of bushwalkers and through-walkers, but most of the time we had the bush to ourselves. Morning tea was held at Thilba Thalba walkers camp and lunch at the also completely empty creek at the Gheerulla Falls creek crossing. We had a quick look at the 'falls' but decided they currently should be called a 'stop' as there wasn't even a trickle of water at the base. Starting to feel our legs we then tackled the last 8km of the hike back down the path which follows Gheerulla Creek itself. It wasn't flowing anywhere, just a series of pools with the causeways half a metre high and dry. No need for walking poles to help to get across! Despite the dry weather, the scenery is still stunning; grass trees, magnificent straight-trunked flooded gums and the wacky curly sedges. We reached the cars again almost dead on the dot of 4pm with quite a few having achieved a first hike of over 25km in one day. A very satisfying achievement.

Vacant Committee Positions Descriptions

A club is only as strong as its committee. Please consider volunteering your time to serve on the committee. To help you decide which positions are suitable for you the position descriptions are below:

Walks Coordinator

- Each six months, prepare the SCBW walks program, contacting all members for walk suggestions, volunteers to lead, and walks nominated.
- Each six months, organise a walks planning meeting to discuss and prepare the walks program for the next six months.
- Present at the club meetings, the walks scheduled for the following month.
 - o Explain the requirements for visitors
 - o Explain the insurance indemnity on the back of each walks sheet
 - Meeting time and place
 - o Leader's contact details
 - o Explain the degree of difficulty for walks
 - o Prepare walk sheets for members to sign in for each club meeting.
 - o Ensure all walk leaders have the walks registration form and visitor forms for their scheduled walk (after club monthly meeting where the walk was presented). If necessary, email the complete Walk Leader 'package' with all forms attached in the email.
- Send email to all members after each monthly members meeting, informing them that they are welcome to register for activities up to the next meeting date. This email will include a link to the club's online calendar for leader contact and activity details.
- Contact members via email of any updates from walk leaders regarding a scheduled walk.
- Add, maintain and update online calendar as required (this process is currently being reviewed)
- Maintain maps for the club including sign in / out book. Bring maps to each monthly club meeting for the availability of all members.
- Attend committee meetings when required.

Membership Officer

- Monitor emails sent to enquiry@scbwc.com and respond accordingly.
- Attend monthly club meetings, greet all visitors and answer any questions.
- Maintain a folder/digital file containing club membership applications and their 3 visitor walk forms.
- Maintain members database.
- Attend committee meetings when required.
